ne luxury car will be hand-made in a super hangar at St Athan in the Vale of Glamorgan. It is a ajor success for Wales as it took two years to secure the deal ahead of 20 locations across the orld. As well as attracting one of motoring's most famous names, it is expected to create abour 200 additional jobs with suppliers and local businesses, the majority of whom will be SMEs.
ston Martin chief executive, Andy Palmer, called it a "momentous day for Wales". The evelopment will include a skills academy, which will make St Athan and the Vale of Glamorgar n engineering centre of excellence. Work on the factory started in 2017 and production wil art in 2020.
he value of the deal is in the hundreds of millions of pounds and it is forecast that the Welsh overnment will be contributing some £5.8 million in support of the project. Some analysts do be agree that the Welsh Government should be supporting Aston Martin in this way and believe at the money would be better spent elsewhere. They point out that major businesses that ere given support in the past, such as Panasonic and Bosch, made more than 1000 workers dundant when they closed their operations in South Wales as a result of changing marke proditions.
